Disaster and Emergency Management in Nigeria: The Case of Chibok School Girls Abducted by Boko Haram Insurgents

Abstract : More than a decade ago, the Islamist Terrorist group called Boko Haram has caused terrible violence in the northeastern part of Nigeria.
