Enactments of Global Citizenship Education: Social Justice in Public Spheres of Education

Abstract : This proposed chapter explains how civic religious literacy is a means to promote social justice in Canada. It will first present the specific conception of global citizenship education that will undergird the discussion in the chapter.
