Spirituality in Adults with Developmental Disabilities in the Practice of Pastoral Care Ministry

Abstract : This paper explores how individuals with disabilities understand and express their spirituality like everyone else can help provide church ministers and religious leaders with new knowledge of human experience and change the way pastoral care ministry is being practiced with this population.
