Ending the Multibillionaire: A Solution to Poverty and Violations of the Right to Health

Abstract : A rampant health crisis is facing America. That health crisis is poverty. Millions of Americans live without knowing when they will eat or where they will sleep. Meanwhile, there are over 600 multi-billionaires in the United States. "In April 2021, U.S. billionaires had nearly twice as much combined wealth than the bottom half of Americans -- \$4.56 trillion vs. \$2.62 trillion." It's disturbingly ironic that we live in a country where there are people with more money than they know what to do with (or could spend in a lifetime) while simultaneously, people are losing their life because they do not have enough money to survive.
