## Tajwīd and Mawwāl Toward Khushūʻ in Islam and Tarab in Arab Music: Common Musical Elements

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**Abstract :** As a significant term in Arab music, tarab identifies a particular expression of feelings and emotions, especially in the vocal practice of Arab music. Tarab aims to take both the performer and the audience from a normal feeling state to a new state of spiritual feeling through the art of mawwāl. Because of the expertise required for mawwāl, the ability to reach tarab has long been considered an indication that a musician has reached a high musical level. Another significant Islamic concept related to feelings and emotions is khushū<sup>c</sup>. It is known that one of the ways to get Khāshe<sup>c</sup> (humble to God) is the artistic reading of the holy Qur'ān. The artistic recitation of the Qur'ān is tajwīd. Like mawwāl, tajwīd requires a high-level rendition to lead the listener to the special emotional state. The research will focus on the relationships between tarab, khushū<sup>c</sup>, tajwīd, and mawwāl in Islamic-Arab culture in a way that has not been addressed previously. The relationships between tajwid and mawwāl, tarab and khushū<sup>c</sup> would be identified through the examination of musical factors, socio-cultural factors, and emotional factors.
