Links and Blocks: the Role of Language in Samuel Beckett's Selected Plays

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Abstract : This article explores the language in the four plays of Samuel Beckett-Waiting for Godot, Endgame, Krapp's Last Tape, and Footfalls. It considers the way in which Beckett uses language, especially through fragmentation utterances, repetitions, monologues, contradictions, and silence. It discusses the function of language in modern society, in the theater of the absurd, and in the plays.
